Course Description:

In Geometry with Data Analysis, students incorporate knowledge and skills in Geometry and Measurement, Algebra and Functions, and Data Analysis, Statistics, and Probability, leading to a deeper understanding of fundamental relationships within the discipline and building a solid foundation for further study.

Classroom Rules and Expectations:

- Be respectful of yourself and everyone in class at all times.
- Be prepared for class every day as soon as the bell rings. This includes having everything you may need for class - materials, homework, etc.
- Arrive on time. Any late arrivals will need to obtain a tardy slip before being permitted to class.
- Pay attention, participate and ask questions. Stay engaged with class.
- Do your best work and turn it in on time. Any assignments turned in late will have points deducted, unless it was for an excused absence.
- No phone zone. Phones will not be permitted during class unless there is an academic reason. Students are expected to keep their phones out of sight and silent.
- Food, drinks and gum are not allowed in the classroom. ONLY WATER is allowed for drinking.
- Headphones are not permitted during class, unless otherwise directed.
- On test day, smartwatches will not be permitted and must be out of sight and silent.

Classroom Consequences

If you choose to not follow classroom rules, then you will receive consequences for your behavior. They will be as follows:

1. Warning
2. Detention during Refuel
3. Detention and Parent Contact/Conference
4. If you continuously choose to not follow classroom rules, then an administrator will be contacted as well as a parent conference.

**Note: Depending on the nature of the rules not followed, Ms. Carpenter may escalate consequences to the proper level.*

Grading Policy:

For each 9 weeks: tests count towards 70% of grade and daily assignments (homework, participation, warm-ups, bell work, quizzes, etc.) count towards 30% of grade. The final exam counts for 20% of the final grade. Although grades will appear in both Schoology and PowerSchool, the only grade that will matter is PowerSchool. I encourage you, parents and students, to check PowerSchool regularly.

The grading scale is as follows: A (90-100%), B (80-89), C (70-79), D (65-69), and F (below 65).

Grades will be a reflection of mastery of the standards. Make sure all absences are excused as class work can be made up and graded for excused absences only.

NOTE: Cheating and plagiarism of any kind are never tolerated. The academic misconduct policy of the school will be followed in this course. Assignments that are turned in late will have points deducted. Any student who receives failing grades during this course is encouraged to meet with me and to discuss this with me so we can devise a plan for improvement.

Make-Up Tests Policy:

Make-up tests will be given for excused absences only. Students must make arrangements with the teacher, and the make-up will be administered on a date to be announced. If the make-up day is missed without prior approval, then the missing grade will automatically remain a zero.

Accommodations:

Requests for accommodations for this course or any school event are welcomed from students and parents.
