Make sure all absences are excused as class work can be made up and graded for excused absences only. The Final Exam counts for 20% of the final grade. Make-up Test Policy: Tests are made up during the Refuel hour any day **except** Tuesday or Friday in room A118. Each student will have 2 opportunities in a two week time frame to make up a test or quiz before a grade of 0 becomes the final grade.
